

My sister Lanie said "share whatever you have. More blessings come'. My sister Margie said "God gives us everything , even though sometimes we think that what we ask is impossible. Always give thanks to the Lord, great and small'.

My sister Lanie was an abandoned wife with six kids. Her husband left her when her youngest twins were wo years old. She was so depressed. She did not have a job. I tried helping her in many ways. Why do I admire her? She was less fortunate one but she had a big heart. She knew she had nothing and still loved to share especially food. She is a great cook. She welcomed everyone, cousins and friends call her 'Mama Lanie'. She finished high school and all her kids finished college and got a job.

My sister Margie was a little strict one. I remember when we were kids she threw a bucket of water on me so I didn't have a reason not to shower. She believes in the power of prayer. She was married but not blessed with kids. She adopted a newly born baby girl because the baby's mom said she couldn't feed her. I ended up taking care of the baby because my sister and her husband found a job in another country. There was a point in her life when they did not even have food on the table. It's not easy to be far away yet have to deal it an still not lucky enough. They gave up everything including their house. What I love about my sister Margie? Despite all the trials and hardship, she never fails to thank the Lord. Her adopted daughter finished college and is now working.

On today's Gospel, Jesus is so compassionate to people. The 5000 followed Him and listened to His teachings. Then when time to eat came and the disciples wanted to send them away because they could not feed the,. But Jesus asked 'what is available'? The answer was 2 fish and 5 loaves of bread. Jesus let the people sit down in groups. He prayed for the food and thanked God the father for those blessings. The disciples distributed them to the people and to their amaze they collected 12 baskets full of left over bread and fish.

En medio de la tormenta en Filipinas el 24 de julio de 2024, abrí mi red social y comencé a preguntarle a mi familia en Alitagtag Batangas "Como están todos". Y luego lo seguí con "Espero que todos estén bien". Mi hermana mayor respondió: "por la gracia de Dios estamos bien". Me dije a mí mismo "Gracias a Dios" y "wow, Internet también está funcionando". Para mantener la conversación, dije: "2 peces, 5 panes, 5000 personas para comer". ¿Qué puedes decir al respecto? Mi hermana Lanie dijo "comparte lo que tengas. Vienen más bendiciones". Mi hermana Margie decía "Dios nos da todo, aunque a veces pensemos que lo que pedimos es imposible. Dad siempre gracias al Señor, grandes y pequeños".

Mi hermana Lanie era una esposa abandonada y tenía seis hijos. Su marido la abandonó cuando sus gemelos menores tenían dos años. Estaba muy deprimida. Ella no tenía trabajo. Intenté ayudarla de muchas maneras. ¿Por qué la admiro? Ella era menos afortunada pero tenía un gran corazón. Sabía que no tenía nada y todavía le encantaba compartir, especialmente la comida. Ella es una gran cocinera. Dio la bienvenida a todos, primos y amigos la llaman "Mama Lanie". Terminó la escuela secundaria y todos sus hijos terminaron la universidad y consiguieron un trabajo.

Mi hermana Margie era un poco estricta. Recuerdo que cuando éramos niños ella me tiró un balde de agua para que no tuviera ningún motivo para no ducharme. Ella cree en el poder de la oración. Estaba casada pero no había sido bendecida con hijos. Adoptó a una niña recién nacida porque la madre de la bebé dijo que no podía alimentarla. Terminé cuidando al bebé porque mi hermana y su esposo encontraron trabajo en otro país. Hubo un momento en su vida en el que ni siquiera tenían comida en la mesa. No es fácil estar lejos y aun así tener que afrontarlo y aún así no tener la suerte. Renunciaron a todo, incluida su casa. ¿Qué es lo que más me gusta de mi hermana Margie? A pesar de todas las pruebas y dificultades, ella nunca deja de agradecer al Señor. Su hija adoptiva terminó la universidad y está trabajando.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús es muy compasivo con la gente. Los 5000 lo siguieron y escucharon sus enseñanzas. Entonces cuando llegó la hora de comer y los discípulos quisieron despedirlos porque no podían alimentarlos. Pero Jesús preguntó "¿qué hay disponible"? La respuesta fue 2 peces y 5 hogazas de pan. Jesús hizo que la gente se sentara en grupos. Oró por la comida y agradeció a Dios padre por esas bendiciones. Los discípulos los repartieron entre la gente y, con asombro, recogieron 12 cestas llenas de pan y pescado sobrantes.

Nuestro Dios es Dios fuerte y nada es imposible para Él. Las cosas tal vez para nosotros sean imposibles pero para Él todo es posible. Confía siempre en Él en todo lo que necesitemos. En el salmo responsorial se dice: "La mano del Señor, nos alimenta". Él responde a todas nuestras necesidades. Orar y pedirle a Dios que esas necesidades estén disponibles y suficientes cuando las necesitemos y agradecerle siempre por todo, las cosas grandes y pequeñas.


